**Alex Watt Garage** Saturday April 4<sup>th</sup> found a small group of us leaving Donut Derelicts for a 100 mile romp down the 405 and 5 to the Sea World area for an Open House at Sandy & Alex Watt's Carriage House in Point Loma. The tour of their garage, vintage toys, antique clothes and library was much more than the normal faire. Here the treat went far beyond a car show to include period correct clothing for both male and female. A walk through closet the full length of the second story above the garage housed all the fittings for an outing from pre-1890s through World War II. Of particular note was the row upon row of old hatboxes each filled and most decorated with hand painted images. Sandy spoke of the never-ending repair of both the clothing and accessories while apologizing for not having the jewelry collection on display. Each item was dutifully tagged identifying its year. She offered the ladies an opportunity to play "dress up". But, no one accepted; although a 1920s flapper dress and an Empire style one tempted Phyllis. Each of them would be acceptable fashion today. Coffee and cookies refreshed the entire crew.



The garage is designed as an old English carriage house to accommodate four carriages --- two single astride a double. Pictured here is an early Aston Martin. The two story unit easily housed four cars and a workshop at ground level with a one post lift and a car elevator to launch vehicles to the second floor where Alex held a model T touring along with three other cars. One of them is a 1901 model with a side tiller steering that appeared similar to the 1886 Benz we would view later that day. Sandy said that the mounted engine is not correct but they do have one in storage. One wall was lined with reference books of all types. Another contained antiques within old glass cased stackable law library shelves. Toys emphasizing the James Bond Astons are clearly of interest.



There were two Argyll cars in pieces on the ground floor. Much of the wood was rotten and so part of the metal frame was set with mockup pieces in preparation for replacement. Here, we saw first hand how the aluminum panels are formed over the wood then nailed in place. I was surprised how the screwed together wood joints and not the metal frame in these early cars carry the load. An old Riley accompanied them.

**Cooley Museum** was our destination after lunching at Nati's restaurant. There, we found that fore mentioned 1886 Benz to a recent Buick prototype. Several Bush cars graced the 1910 era, a tandem 2 seater reminded me of the Messerschmitt car from the 50s, toys dated to 1870, cameras from 1900, toy trains from the turn of the century, tools of every kind and I think the red sled was used by Santa. A monstrous 1913 Cadillac touring was like that owned by

the Harris'. The white horse looked like the ones at Dave Rudderow's house. But, it didn't go up and down. Never the less, there was a big music thingy from a merry-go-round that played "How much is that doggie in the window?"
